Saturday, November 29: Arrival in Paris

Transfer from your arrival airport to your hotel. We'll let you settle in and will give you a map of the area allowing you to easily find your way around. You will find it easy to get to the Halle Carpentier which is close to your accommodation.

Sunday, November 30: City Tour

Monday, October 31: Memorable Paris

The Place du Chatelet to the Place des Vosges, strolling, shopping and heritage: anything is possible.

The Gothic Tour Saint-Jacques is a few steps from the fountain of the Chatelet built to the glory of Napoleon. The neo-Renaissance City Hall even has a courtyard used for beach volleyball. The church of Saint-Eustache, where Molière was baptised, is adjacent to the metal walkways of the garden of Les Halles. The Renaissance reliefs of the Fountain of the Innocents stands opposite the Pompidou Center, the Parisian architectural landmark of the twentieth century, dedicated to contemporary culture.
